9. Any Other Business

The Chairman invited members to ask questions.

Terry Rand said that he had twice been hospitalised after being injured by cyclists riding on the pavement in Falloden Way. Despite requests to LB Barnet they had not erected signage to remind cyclists that this is forbidden.

A discussion took place regarding the poor state of Suburb roads and the numerous pot holes.

Residents wanted more resources made available and better quality of workmanship for road maintenance and repairs.

The Councillors noted these comments and said that this had been an exceptionally bad winter.

They assured residents that Erskine Hill would be resurfaced and they were trying hard to follow up residents' requests and plan road repairs according to need.

Suburb pavements were made up of a more expensive stone than any other part of the Borough

The Councillors said that they wanted to build up a good relationship with the RA.

On behalf of the HGS RA Emma Howard thanked David Lewis for all the work he has carried out for the Suburb over many years.
