- (b) Any such standing orders may make provision for an executive committee or other standing or
- (a) The Council shall meet as soon as possible after the Annual General Meeting and shall elect an Executive Committee consisting of the Officers and up to five other Members of
- (b) Between meetings of the Council the Executive Committee shall conduct the affairs of the Association on behalf of the Council, with power to act in the name of the Association, but shall not take any action or decision likely to affect seriously or irrevocably the interests of residents without the prior approval of the Council.
- (c) Notwithstanding paragraph (b) of this Clause, the Executive Committee may take any action which they decide is necessary in the interests of residents and required by great urgency, provided that such action is within 30 days submitted for approval to a meeting of the Council.
- (d) The Executive Committee shall serve until the next Annual General Meeting and its Members shall be eligible for re-election.
- (e) The Executive Committee shall meet as often as it thinks fit and at least four times a year, and five Members present shall be a quorum.
- (f) Casual vacancies among the ordinary Members of the Executive Committee may be filled by the Council from among the Members of the Council.
- (g) Any Member of the Executive Committee ceasing to be a Member of the Council shall retire forthwith from the Executive Committee.
- (h) The Executive Committee may appoint Members or Associate Members as assistant officers to assist in the management of the Association's affairs or to perform special duties, and such assistant officers may be invited to attend the meetings of the Executive Committee and/or the Council, but shall not ex-officio be Members of the Committee or the Council
