The Chairman said that this will be edited and ready by Easter. Emails had been sent to the Phoenix cinema about the possibility of hosting the Premier of the film.

5 Question Time

St Jude's Proms

Susie Gregson asked why the RA 'is disassociating itself' from St Jude's. She said the proms are all run by volunteers and all profits are given to charity. The RA should be using the Proms to market itself. Sponsorship of the free lunchtime concerts had already been agreed as well as the opening night.

The Chairman replied that the RA was not "disassociating itself" from the Proms at St Judes and said it was unfortunate that the Proms had allocated the Residents Association's usual night without prior discussion with the RA.

Centenary Museum

Marjorie Harris referred to a letter she had written in the Suburb News where she had suggested that there should be a small museum on the Suburb to house a permanent display of Suburb archives and artefacts. The Horticultural Society had many items which they would like to display. She had received a positive response to her letter from residents. The Chairman thought that it was an excellent idea and Marjorie Harris said that she would be happy to serve on a small committee to progress this.

Carol Boulter would like this proposal added to the list of possible projects which could include the rebuilding of Fellowship House rebuilt as a community centre as well as possibly housing the proposed museum. Eva Jacobs would like somewhere to store all the Suburb Archives and Simon Abbott supported the idea of having a community centre on the Suburb. Derek Epstein suggested that Council members prepare a list of projects for discussion at a future meeting.

6 St Jude's Proms

The EC had proposed that as the Proms are now well established and making a surplus of £68,000 that it would be a better use of RA funds to offer seed money for new projects on the Suburb and to phase out the current RA grant. It proposed that a grant of £1,500 be made in 2008 to sponsor the free lunchtime concerts

Richard Wakefield said that the EC minutes did not report his and David Littaur's opposition to the proposal. He spoke strongly in favour of raising the grant to the St Jude's Proms rather than reducing it.

David Littaur gave a detailed explanation of why he thought the Proms deserved to have its level of sponsorship maintained, not cut.

The Chairman told Council that he had asked the organising committee if he could make a speech at the Proms last year without success.

In reply to a question from Derek Chandler, Susie Gregson said that last year £52,000 had been given to Toynbee Hall and £17,000 to the North London Hospice

Douglas Blausten said that if it is not the RA's role to give money to charity for causes outside the Suburb, the organisers should give something to the RA by helping us to promote the RA in a more positive way. He suggested that the EC and the Proms committee discuss ways to give the RA a higher profile. He suggested that the relationship between the RA and the Proms committee should be a different one from that with other commercial sponsors.

Simon Abbott opposed phasing out the RA support for the Proms and thought that at least £2,750 should be given this year.

Steve Morris supported the Proms but the difficult issue is the level of sponsorship by the RA. He thought that sponsorship of the lunchtime concerts were a good idea but unfortunately that sponsorship had also already been taken by another sponsor.

He considered that the RA should support new events on the Suburb and a significant donation to the Proms may take away the ability to seed and fund other events. He would support a limited donation.

Janet Elliott also personally supported the proms and she was well aware of the work involved artistically and financially. She pointed out that the RA is also run by the voluntary work of its members and often cannot get sponsorship for what it does. This year the Membership committee has tried very hard to raise money and get an increase in its subscriptions. If the RA gave £4000 to the proms it would be giving 20% of its subscription income which may not be a popular selling point for members

Eva Jacobs would like to know more about the finances of Toynbee Hall.

Selwyn Nakan said that the RA was instrumental in getting the Proms established at an early stage. Now that the organisers have found a number of other sponsors the RA should not be

joined together with them and we should have a special relationship.

Susie Gregson said that the concert on the last night and the concert with the male voice choir are still available for sponsorship. The Chairman asked whether the RA could have gold sponsorship at the silver sponsorship rate.

Richard Kemp said that the RA should seek the opportunity to be present at all concerts to present the work of the RA to the audience and run a venue membership recruitment campaign.

Simon Abbott liked the idea of sponsoring the free lunchtime concerts and suggested that the RA put in a bid for next year.

A Motion was proposed by the Chairman and seconded by Selwyn Nakan that the RA give the sum of £1,500 towards the St Jude's Proms for 2008. This was defeated by 8 votes in favour and 10 against.

A Motion was proposed by Simon Abbott and seconded by Carol Boulter that the RA give the sum of £2,750 towards the St Jude's proms for 2008. This was passed by 12 votes in favour and 4 against.

A Motion was proposed by Richard Wakefield and seconded by David Littaur that the RA give £4,000 towards the St Jude's Proms for 2008. This was defeated by 3 votes in favour and 10 against.

7 Approval of draft Accounts for 2007

John Boulter said that the accounts had been prepared in the same way but with more income and expenditure items. The computer was unable to break down the Centenary items into brochure, centenary events, memorabilia and appeals leaflet Derek Epstein suggested having two columns for normal operational and Centenary operations.

The sum of £10,000 should be reserved for the removal of street clutter as had been previously agreed.

John Boulter said that the RA must produce proper accounts and it is optional whether the Centenary items are shown separately When the Centenary figures are all available they can be presented in a separate table with a break down of all the figures and this can be published in the Suburb news.

All the money donated to the Centenary Appeal through the Trust had been given back to the RA as a charitable donation with a few bills paid directly by the Trust.

John Boulter said that the question of taxation is being considered.

8 Nomination of officers for 2008

David B Lewis agreed to stand as Chairman for a further year although he said that it would be his last year David Lewis agreed to stand as Vice-Chairman Richard Wakefield is retiring as Hon Secretary Brian Rivett agreed to stand as Hon Secretary John Boulter agreed to stand as Hon Treasurer

A Motion was proposed by Richard Wakefield and seconded by Leonie Stephen to nominate David B Lewis, David Lewis, Brian Rivett and John Boulter as officers.

9 Implementation of the 6 year rule in 2008

The Chairman explained that this rule had been formally suspended for each of the past 5 years. Any Council member who has been on a committee for 6 years or more can continue on the committee if successful in a secret ballot. The standing orders are ambiguous as to whether the rule applies also to coopted members. If Council agreed to this Motion there would be a ballot in March

Carol Boulter who has served on Consam for many years said that her committee always has had fresh blood and it is useful to have someone who has been on the committee for several years

Proposal to Close Golders Green Police Station

A consultation paper had been circulated to Council members by Derek Chandler about the future policing of the Borough and the proposal to close Golders Green Police Station.

At present there are three Safer Neighbourhood teams at Golders Green police station but the Safer Neighbourhood team for the Suburb operates from High Road East Finchley. These premises are not open to the Public. Council would like to have the Safer Neighbourhood team operating within the Suburb.

The consultation document said that that the Golders Green police station front office will not close until replacement premises are found with a front desk.

The EC will formulate a view on these proposals. The consultation paper will be posted on the HGS Discussion Group with the form for completion. There is a period of three months for responding to these proposals

Petitions

Derek Chandler had prepared a paper which had been emailed to Council together with a Consultative paper issued by the Government. This concerns local petition submitted to local authorities and it places a duty on the local authority to respond constructively. He said that it would be useful to support a move to ensure that local authorities give a constructive response to a petition and are not be able to ignore it Individuals are asked to respond and comments should be sent in by 20 March.

Derek Chandler agreed to draft a response on behalf of the RA which will be discussed by the EC.
